The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Hagerman Joint School District No. 233, Gooding and Twin Falls Counties, Idaho, was convened at 7:00 p.m. on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2016, in the Media Center of the Hagerman Jr/Sr High School, Hagerman, Idaho, pursuant to authority provided by ID Section 74-206.

## A. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting opened at 7:01 p.m. with Chairman Karl Emerson presiding.

# D. REPORTS

1. Superintendent Eric Anderson:

- Post Legislative Tour tomorrow in Twin Falls-get details of 2016/2017 budget;
- Blue Cross meeting Thursday in Twin Falls-get details of percentage increase for 2016/2017;
- Friday will be ½ day of inservice for staff;
- Projections discussed up 2016/2017 school budget with student enrollment ADA numbers resulting in allowing 22 teaching positions. Discussed with principals and maintenance department of need to curb spending if possible;
- Food Service-LaVina Tellez is filing for a competitive equipment grant of \$9100 for replacement of sanitizer/dishwasher;
- Last of FFVP (Fresh Fruit Vegetable Program) is at the end of grant monies and Ms. Tellez will be stopping the program for rest of school year;
- No summer school will be offered next year or a SFSP (Summer Food Service Program) program and the three food service staff have summer engagements.

Trustee Chuck Steele asked about meeting 4-day school projections. It was discussed how ADA is not as high as hoped but still keeping at 95%. It has helped with staff recruitment and reduction of some classified positons. Positive side is offerings of RTI to students. Administration will get information out to community later this school year of 4-day school results.
