HAGERMAN JOINT SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 233 ANNUAL MEETING OF THE SCHOOL BOARD HELD JULY 10, 2012

The annual meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Hagerman Joint School District No. 233, Gooding and Twin Falls Counties, Idaho, was convened at 6:30 p.m. on the 9th day of July, 2013, in the Media Center of the Hagerman Jr/Sr High School, Hagerman, Idaho, pursuant to authority provided by ID Section 33-510.

A. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting opened at 6:30 p.m. with Superintendent Ty Jones presiding.

B. ROLL CALL & VISITORS

Present were Trustee Karl Emerson, Trustee Mark Daily, Trustee Harry DeWolfe, Trustee Kim White, and Trustee Chuck Steele. Also present were Superintendent Ty Jones, District Clerk Bette Reed. Principal Mark Kress was absent. Visitors were parents/student A for expulsion hearing.

C. OATH OF THE OFFICE

Trustees Mark Daily, Harry DeWolfe, and Chuck Steele took the Trustee's Oath of Office for trustee term 2013 through 2017.

D. EXECUTIVE SESSION

Superintendent Jones announced that the next order of business would be adjourning to executive session. <u>Motion</u> (DeWolfe/Daily) Carried to go into executive session.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Hagerman Joint School District No. 233 recess from a regular meeting into executive session pursuant to Section 67-2345. The executive session was held in the media center of the Jr/Sr High School at 6:36pm

(1)(b) Idaho Code, to consider the evaluation, dismissal or disciplining of, or to hear complaints or charges brought against, a public officer, employee, staff member, individual agent, or public school student. The Chairman called for individual vote which was as follows:

BE IT FURTHER, that following the executive session the Board will reconvene in public session for the purpose of continuing the meeting. Vote being had on the above and foregoing resolution, and the same having been counted and found to be no less than two-thirds (2/3) of the membership in favor thereof, the chairperson declared said resolution adopted. Invited to the executive session were Supt. Jones and Clerk Reed. Also invited to the executive session were session were session were parents and student.

Expulsion hearing commenced. Discussion of high absentee and conditions not met under Pre-Expulsion Hearing attended by parents, students, Supt Jones, and Principal Kress. Parents/student left at 6:54pm Discussion continued on options for expulsion. Also discussed during executive session were Out-of-District student applications and Supt. Jones's proposal for balancing the 2014/2015 budget which may affect staffing, employee benefits, and class sizes.

Executive session ended at 7:19pm

E. OPEN SESSION

<u>Motion</u> (Daily/White) Carried to accept out-of-district student applications as presented. <u>Motion</u> (Emerson/White) Carried that expulsion be taken into abeyance unless violation of an unexcused absence occurs. A contract with student A and parents to be written with terms set out in executive session.

F. REORGANIZATION OF BOARD

1. Election of Officers

Supt. Jones opened the floor for nominations of Chairman of the Board.

Trustee Mark Daily nominated Trustee Karl Emerson. Motion (Daily/DeWolfe) Carried to elect Trustee Karl Emerson as Chairman of the Board. Trustee Karl Emerson was declared Chairman of the Board.

Supt. Jones surrendered the meeting to Chairman Karl Emerson.

Chairman Emerson opened the floor for nominations of Vice Chairman of the Board. Trustee Chuck Steele moved, 2nd by Trustee Harry DeWolfe to nominate Trustee Mark Daily as Vice Chairman. Vote: Carried. Trustee Mark Daily was declared Vice-Chairman of the Board.

Chairman Emerson opened the floor for nomination of Secretary/Treasurer of the Board. Trustee Mark Daily moved, 2nd by Trustee Chuck Steele to nominate Trustee Harry DeWolfe as Secretary/Treasurer. Vote: Carried. Trustee Harry DeWolfe was declared Secretary/Treasurer of the Board.

2. Schedule of Board Meetings, and Public Posting Places.

Motion (Daily/Steele) Carried to maintain same schedule as previous year.

1-hold board meetings on the 2nd Tuesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Library of the Jr/Sr High; 2-Post notices at Hagerman Post Office, Hagerman Jr/Sr High School and Hagerman Elementary School; 3.-Allow over-night trips for extra-curricular activities/competitions within the State of Idaho; 4.-Continue with check signers Chairman Karl Emerson and Vice-Chairman Mark Daily. Also to allow Clerk Reed to pursue an electronic signature to be used on checks as they are printed.

H. REPORTS

1. Superintendent Ty Jones:

- Good news as for acquiring the superintend endorsement on teaching certificate. He does not need to take a Reading Literacy class so he can now apply for the updated certificate;
- Next school year the Department of Education will test students with SBAC (Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium). Supt. Jones feels there will be a dip in scores being this is a new testing procedure but will also give the district a year to work out the bugs;
- Hagerman School District received a 4-star rating from the State Dept. of Education from the 2012/2013 school year student testing. Some of the areas of testing dipped but that was expected due to huge growth the previous year. The ISAT test will be going away. Areas of improvement were in Advanced Opportunities and College Entrance scores;
- Next year every student in the junior class will take the PSAT test;
- The Summer Food Service Program has been feeding upwards of 50 students/adults each day in operation;
- Visited with the City of Hagerman Mayor Pete Weir on the monthly water bills as they increased 348%. An adjustment was made for previous/current month's bill and will check calculations on next bill;
- Still looking for a certified K-12 Art Teacher. Have interviewed one but she took job in Emmett which is close to where she now lives and will be interviewing another teacher this Thursday.
- The LEP paraprofessional position is still open.

The Board wishes to convey their thanks to LaVina Tellez for doing a good job.

Trustee White asked about reimbursement for coaches traveling in own vehicles to games under the 50-mile radius. Supt. Jones will visit with A.D. Cato about possibility to come out of HS Student Body Athletic Funds.

Supt. Jones noted that he will be paying to the district his share of property tax levied due to supplemental levy. He would like to have it designated for the Read Like an Eagle program in the elementary school.

Clerk Reed noted that she will most likely need to cash out some of the school's Certificate of Deposits to pay for Levy expenditures being done now due to cash flow problem. Clerk Reed commented that if everyone paid their taxes, the school will receive one half of the levy proceeds (\$75,000) in January 2014 and the other half payment in July 2014. The same tax revenues should be recognized in January 2015 and July 2015.
